14. **GENERAL POLICIES**

- 1. Funerals are not held on Sundays in the Methodist Church, neither is Methodist Clergy nor Local Preachers available to do funerals on Sundays
- 2. The Minister must receive the Permission to Bury Certificate issued by the Registrar before the Funeral Service for verification purposes.
- 3. A Non-Refundable Fee of 50% of the total Fees must be paid at the first meeting with the Minister where the payment of fees is applicable. The balance of the Fees must be paid to the Church Office before the time of the Funeral Service.
- 4. All applicable fees must be paid to the Church Office with cheques payable to "*The Methodist Church*." All payments should be reflected with the issuance of a receipt with the Church stamped affixed.
- 5. It is the policy and practice of the Methodist Church that caskets are not opened once they are closed prior to the commencement of the Thanksgiving (Funeral) Service.
- 6. It is not the practice nor the preference of the Methodist Church to reuse burial spots. The reuse of a burial spot requires that the spot has not been used for at least twenty-five (25) years.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the Contact Person of the deceased to ensure that when a burial spot is being dug that the excavated dirt is not placed on existing graves or tombs. Any large boulders excavated must be removed from the cemetery.
- 8. Only the graves of Members who were in Good Standing at the time of their death will be permitted to be entombed at the applicable cost associated with entombment.
- 9. It is the sole right of the Methodist Church to permit or refuse a deceased Non-Member or a deceased Member not in Good Standing from being buried in its cemetery. Should the church permit the burial the fee payable to the church is reflected in the fee structure outlined in this document.
- 10. A free-will offering is encouraged to be taken during the Funeral Service of deceased Members in Good Standing to assist with cemetery upkeep or any other ministry of the Church that the family might decide.
